

Intake

Average cycle time from complaint receipt, to the date the complaint was assigned to an investigator.

Target: 9 Days



Intake & Investigation

Average cycle time from complaint receipt to closure of the investigation process. Does <u>not</u> include cases sent to the Attorney General or other forms of formal discipline.


Target: 125 Days Q2 Average: 104 Days



Formal Discipline/ Administrative Action

Average cycle time to complete the entire enforcement process for those cases closed by the AG's office after referral by the program. Does not include declined, withdrawn or dismissed cases.

Target: 540 Days Q2 Average: 700 Days



Probation Intake

Average number of days from monitor assignment, to the date the monitor makes first contact with the probationer.

Target: 25 Days Q2 Average: 7 Days
