

Enforcement Performance Measures


Q1 Report (July - September 2016)

Number of complaints closed or assigned to an investigator.






PM2 | Intake - Cycle Time

Target Average: 9 Days | Actual Average: 3 Days



PM4 | Formal Discipline - Volume




PM4 | Formal Discipline – Cycle Time²


